ASTM Symposium on Effects of Aggregates and Mineral Fillers on Asphalt Mixture Performance

Papers are invited for a Symposium on The Effects of Aggregates and Mineral Fillers on Asphalt Mixture Performance sponsored by ASTM Committee D-4 on Road and Paving Materials. This symposium will be held 11 Dec. 1991 in San Diego, Cali-

fornia in conjunction with the 10–13 Dec. 1991 standards development meetings of Committee D-4.

The symposium will provide an opportunity for researchers and practicing engineers to present data and observations of the role and effects of aggregate and mineral filler properties on the performance of asphalt mixtures in pavement applications both for high-traffic highways and use on lower volume applications in streets and roads. Of particular interest are: the effects of aggregates and mineral fillers on rutting and creep of mixtures in service; effects on sensitivity of asphalt mixtures to moisture in service; and work on measuring and describing properties of aggregates and mineral fillers that affect performance. Among the important properties of aggregates and mineral fillers which may influence performance are grading, particle shape, minerological composition, surface chemistry, porosity, surface texture, as well as particle strength and resistance to degradation or deterioration during construction and service.

Third NCB International Seminar on Cement and Building Materials to Be Held in New Delhi, India

The National Council for Cement and Building Materials (NCB), as the apex body for research, technology development

and transfer, education and industrial services for the cement and building materials industries, is organizing the Third NCB International Seminar on Cement and Building Materials, to be held 21–25 Jan. 1991 in New Delhi, India. The Seminar will review the state-of-art of cement, lime, and allied technologies, highlight recent developments, and provide an appropriate forum for exchange of views among international experts. Since the scenario in other developing countries is quite similar, this seminar would also discuss issues of particular interest to other developing countries. An important concern of the Seminar will be to assist the cement and building materials industries in various countries in their technological cooperation and collaboration among both developed and developing countries.

The technical deliberations at the Seminar will cover the whole spectrum from manufacture to utilization with focus on latest innovations in technology for manufacture and use of cement and building materials under the following themes:

- 1. Productivity enhancement in operating plants including energy conservation.
- 2. Modernization of manufacture of cement and allied building materials through improved techniques and installations.
 - 3. Newer technologies, processes, equipment, and products.
- 4. Review of performance and uses of cement and allied building materials.

Papers covering any of the theme subjects are invited from the participants. The titles of the proposed papers along with an abstract (not more than 300 words) preferably should reach NCB on or before 30 April 1990, and the complete paper should be received by 15 Oct. 1990.

There will be an exhibition of posters, charts, photographs, and scale models bearing on the themes of the Seminar. Short technical films on new developments will also be screened.

The Seminar will provide an ideal opportunity to manufacturers of cement, lime, and allied building materials, machinery manufacturers, designers and consultants, R&D scientists, technologists and engineers, economists and users of cement and building materials, to deliberate in an integrated and interrelated manner on the latest national and international trends in the manufacture and use of cement and building materials and problems associated therewith.

Registration fee is \$500 per delegate, accompanying persons (spouses) \$200 per person. Registration is up to 31 Oct. 1990.
